Study	Select and use activities and resources, with help when needed. This helps them to achieve a goal they have chosen, or one which is suggested to them. Develop their sense of responsibility and membership of a community. Become more outgoing with unfamiliar people, in the safe context of their setting. Show more confidence in new social settings. Play with one or more other children, extending and elaborating play ideas. Help to find solutions to conflict and rivalries. For example, accepting that not everyone can be Spider-Man in a game and suggesting other ideas. Increasingly follows rules, understanding why they are important. Do not always need an adult to remind them of a rule. Develop and appropriate way of being assertive. Talks to others to resolve conflict. Talk about their feelings using words like "happy", "sad," "angry" and "worried." Begin to understand how others might be feeling. Be able to express a point of view and to debate when they disagree with an adult or friend, using words as well as actions.(CL)	See themselves as a valuable individual. Identify and moderate their own feelings socially and emotionally. Think about the perspectives of others. Manage their own needs. Be confident to try new activities and show independence, resilience and perseverance in the face of challenge. Explain the reasons for rules, know right from wrong and try to behave accordingly. Manage their own basic hygiene and personal needs, including dressing, going to the toilet and understanding the importance of healthy food choices.
