The Dragon Machine by Helen Ward

The main outcomes of this will be that the children will create a dragon guide and encyclopedia (reports), dragon machine explanation, letter of advice, shopping list, description, letters in role and their own version of the story.

The Great Fire of London

This is a two-week sequence for *The Great Fire of London* by Emma Adams and James Weston Lewis, in which the children explore London in the present and the past, through the story of the Great Fire of London. Children compare the London of today and the London of 1666, using past and present tense. They explore the cause of the fire of London through interviewing the baker, planning and recording appropriate questions, and design safety posters using imperative verbs to write commands. They then write diary entries from the point of view of the cat that Samuel Pepys saw being rescued from the ashes.
