School Absences

There are an increasing number of parents asking to collect children from school before the end of the school day, this term. It is important that if your child has a hospital appointment that the office staff have sight of an appointment letter or text. It is possible to attach photographic evidence on the school App.

As far as it is possible, you should arrange for someone else to collect your children from school if you have an appointment that prevents you from collecting at the end of the school day. If you have no alternative but to collect your child early, it is important that you share an appointment notification with the office staff.

Regularly leaving school early has an impact on valuable learning opportunities and gives our children the wrong attitude towards the value of education. Thank you for your co-operation.

Online Safety



The Government have maintained a high target of 97% for attendance this year. The National average is currently 95.2%. We currently have 35 pupils with 100% attendance and 74 pupils with 97% or above.

We must, however, keep trying to either maintain good attendance or improve attendance if early absences have affected your child.

You will continue to receive the monthly notice of your child's current attendance. **This is for information only**. Mrs Brooksbank or the Educational Welfare Officer, Connie Harvey, will get in touch with families where attendance is of some concern.

Punctuality for many children is excellent. Thank you to those parents who make the daily effort to bring their children to school on time!

Mrs Jenions will be contacting families this week where children are only minutes late each day. This can be easily rectified by leaving the house just a little bit earlier or walking faster down the High Street. Parents who allow their Y6 children to walk to school may wish to check that their child is arriving on time and not getting distracted on their way to school.

We are considering some incentives to help families get to school on time, particularly as the dark, cold months are rapidly approaching.

Term Dates are available at the Welcome Desk and on the school website to ensure that holidays are not booked during term time. Fines will automatically be issued for families taking holidays in term time. This is a Local Authority policy.
