English

The children will study texts on the theme of confidence and caution.

*'Jim A Cautionary Tale' by Hilaire Belloc

The children will begin by exploring a range of scenarios and their consequences, in order to make predictions about the contents of this tale. They will learn and perform sections of the poem before children create their own cautionary tale.

*'The Day I Swapped My Dad for Two Goldfish' by Neil Gaiman discuss the story, identifying the different characters and their voices by using dramatised reading. identify the features and conventions of written dialogue, which children will draw upon to write their own missing scenes from the book. Children will consider the story from the perspective of Dad and write a diary entry in role. and then their own sequel.

Maths

Topics covered this half term are:

- Time
- Properties of shape
- Statistics

ICT - Internet Research & Communication

This unit focuses on how to effectively search using key words and how to safely communicate online. They will learn the importance of word order when searching and start to examine the results returned and how to distinguish between a reliable and unreliable website. They will learn to save webpages in a browser, as well as in a file or folder.

Religious Education - Islam

The children will be looking at the development of Islam, where the religion started, and how it developed.

Science - Scientists & Inventors

This unit will teach the children about famous scientists and inventors linked to the Y3 science curriculum. They will learn about the men and women who risked their lives to find new plants. The children will learn about Marie Curie and her work on radiation. They will find out about William Smith and how he learnt that the fossils found inside rocks can be used to tell the age of the rocks. They will learn about Inge Lehmann, the woman who discovered that the Earth's core is solid. They will also have the chance to investigate how images change in convex and concave mirrors and will create their own electromagnet and test its strength.
